



Architect Selected for Elizabeth Taylor Medical Center Redevelopment

WASHINGTON— Whitman-Walker Health (WWH) and Fivesquares Development announced today they have selected Selldorf Architects to design the redevelopment of the Elizabeth Taylor Medical Center (ETMC) site.

Last year, WWH announced that it had entered into an agreement with Fivesquares Development to redevelop ETMC via a joint venture partnership model.

Selldorf Architects is a 65-person architectural design practice that was founded by Annabelle Selldorf in 1988. Annabelle Selldorf's award-wining designs span a unique range of projects. These include cultural and gallery spaces; new residential buildings, many in sensitive historic districts in Manhattan; the innovative Sunset Park Materials Recovery Facility on the Brooklyn waterfront,; the renovation of a former Studebaker Auto Garage into co-working space and the Berg'n cafe in Crown Heights, Brooklyn; and a recently announced primary school in Zambia.

WWH's Board of Directors and Fivesquares will work with Selldorf on plans for the full-block site over the next several months. The site will include space for WWH and the community, as well as ground floor retail uses and residential units in a truly unique mixed-use development.

"We are thrilled that the redevelopment of the 1701 14th Street site will be the first design in the nation's capital for Annabelle Selldorf and her team," said Don Blanchon, WWH Executive Director. "Selldorf has garnered acclaim for working in close partnership with their clients and designing from the inside out. That's absolutely critical for this project. We knew we needed an architect who would take the time to truly understand Whitman-Walker's unique place within metro DC's LGBTQ community and our unwavering commitment to our patients. I am certain that Annabelle and her team will make the investment of time, talent and heart needed to achieve such understanding."

ETMC, located at 1701 14^{th} St, NW, currently houses select direct services and staff space to support the health care operations at WWH's other sites, as well as WWH's administrative departments. These functions will continue to operate out of ETMC for the next several years.
